The Board of Davis County Commissioners met for their regularly scheduled meeting at 10:00 AM on September 30, 2025, in room 303 of the Davis County Administration Building, 61 South Main Street, Farmington, Utah. Required legal notice of this meeting was given.

This small piece of property is along Rick's Creek in Centerville and is part of the I-15 rebuild from Salt Lake to Farmington. Since this will affect a drainage basin, it was reviewed by Adam Wright, Director of Public Works, who "feels good about it." The Property Committee also unanimously recommended it.

Commissioner Kamalu invited Grant Jex, Tricia Davis Winter, and Ryan Steinbeigle to the podium for recognition. Davis Community Housing Authority (DCHA) is not a County group, but a partner to the County, particularly with housing. Housing is a big issue in Utah, being one of the most expensive markets in the

nation, and is the main driver of housing instability and homelessness. In 2019, Commissioner Kamalu was able to view some DCHA inventory throughout the County, applauding that it blended into other housing units, and she realized its importance. She recognized the new members of the DCHA's Board: Grant Jex is a very devoted and unpaid Chair, Tricia is with the State's Housing and Community Development department, and Ryan works with grants that come through Davis County.

Grant thanked the Commissioners and welcomed Tricia and Ryan to the DCHA Board, saying they anticipate great things moving forward. The focus is to expand lower-income housing to reduce the homeless population in Davis County.

CLOSING REMARKS

Brian McKenzie, County Clerk, gave details on upcoming events taking place as the municipal general election approaches.

1. The Pre-election Test and Audit event will take place on Friday, October 10th, at 10:00 AM in the Davis County Administrative Building. It is open to the public to observe the process, ask questions, and learn what is done to ensure that County elections are safe and secure.
2. Ballots for the municipal elections, which are occurring in 14 of the 15 cities, will begin arriving in the mail starting October 14th.
3. The County will host their regular pre-election Election Town Hall and Tour on Wednesday, October 15th, at 6:00 PM. Citizens are invited to tour the election facility, ask any questions related to elections, and watch a presentation on how elections are administered in Davis County.

Commissioner Crofts was able to attend the Pioneer Adult Rehabilitation Center (PARC) Award Ceremony, stating it was one of the best events he has attended, and acknowledged the work they put in to make a difference. PARC, established in 1971, is a vocational rehabilitation program that works with students and individuals with disabilities, operating here in Davis County.

Commissioner Crofts also recognized Commissioner Bob Stevenson for achieving a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Chamber of Commerce. When accepting the award, Commissioner Stevenson thanked those in his life — like his wife and mother, as well as those who have mentored him — and brought in pictures from his youth.

Commissioner Crofts attended a Scholarship Pageant as a judge and praised the younger generation, whose stories of the challenges they've had to overcome convinced him that this generation will thrive and be "some of the best people ever." Commissioner Crofts talked about the outreach from the community he's received lately, from people wanting to be more involved. At a Town Hall held a few weeks ago, a discussion was held about bringing a local newspaper back to Davis County. Bryan Scott, publisher of the Davis Journal, said that if every household in the County were to pay around \$2.50, a county-wide newspaper could be re-established.

Commissioner Crofts said that the Town Hall has fueled a desire for more engagement from the people and is optimistic that this will help Davis County in the right direction. He discussed that at his next Town Hall, he is considering having a moderator from within the community, where they will discuss ways to increase community engagement.

Commissioner Crofts finished his closing remarks by addressing the high cost of housing, noting that in today's market, he could not afford a house in Davis County with his current salary. The Utah League of Cities and Towns is involved in some legislation, and the topic of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) has been discussed, which could potentially help alleviate some of the issues. Commissioner Crofts suggested that the topic of housing remain a focus in the public's discussions.

Commissioner Kamalu confirmed that Job Corps is still functioning in Davis County, with a location in the Freeport Center area. However, it is under stress and operating with only a fraction of its staff and former student body, causing concerns about its future. Commissioners Kamalu and Crofts were judges at the Jail Art Show, where both staff and inmates shared their art, and Commissioner Kamalu commended the program and gave her appreciation for being invited to participate.

Commissioner Kamalu congratulated Ryan Steinbeigle for being one of three people from the counties recognized by the State for their efforts related to Code Blue and the winter response; she said the award was well-deserved. She also acknowledged that the Davis Journal's coverage of such issues has helped increase the public's understanding of what is being done.

Commissioner Kamalu announced that budget meetings will continue to occur and are open to the public. She thanked Controller Scott Parke and his team for their year-round work, especially during this season, to prepare the budget for the fiscal year, which is the calendar year.

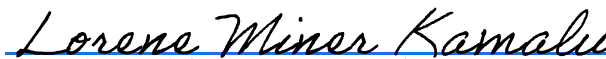
MEETING ADJOURNED
